What is the best advice that your mother/father ever gave you?

A bit cliché, but very true—Honesty is the best policy. Also, no matter what you do in life, make sure you do the best you can do.

What part of the building process do you enjoy the most?

Creating something substantial, meaningful and beautiful. I can remember when I was 15 years old spending hours walking the frames of homes being built in our neighborhood. My friends

would be bugging me to go play, but there was something about being in a house under construction and watching the house be built that still mesmerizes me to this day.

Any fun stories to share while building one of your homes?

Early on in my building career, I learned the importance of being overly specific and detailed. I asked the plumber's helper to install a toilet that had just been delivered and was still in the box in the hallway outside of the bathroom. At the time, I thought I had explained exactly what needed to be done. When I returned, to my amazement, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a toilet was completely plumbed and installed. The bowl had cracked during the shipment and when the toilet was removed from the box, $\frac{1}{2}$ of the bowl shattered further. This however, did not deter the hard working plumber's helper. I now make sure to explain that when installing fixtures, please make sure they are all usable once installed.

What is your favorite place to vacation?

Seattle in the summer time, and Santa Barbara in the winter. New Zealand is also o.k.

Describe what you aspire to be doing 10 years from now.

Being able to spend an entire weekday walking on the beach with my wife, having a leisurely lunch, maybe even a nap in the middle of the day

If you were to design a house for yourself right now, where would you build, and describe the key elements/function and reasons why.

I would build near the water and would build a home that would seam-lessly intertwine indoor and outdoor living. It would blur that separation to where most of the rooms could feel like you are both inside and out. This would include multiple buildings, window walls, flooring that flows from interior rooms to outdoor verandas, outdoor courtyards – both open and covered, and all natural materials. Too often homes are designed that close people off and try to shield them from the very environment that caused them to build there in the first place. This dream home would embrace the locale and encourage life indoors and out.
